



Well Drilling Activity Begins Soon for Gilbert Wells Program (EN2301)

Gilbert continues to evaluate its water resource portfolio to serve Gilbert residents and businesses now and into the future. Gilbert's current supplies include surface water, reclaimed water, and groundwater, and Gilbert combines these water resources to strategically meet the water needs of the community.

In an effort to provide for current and future drinking water demands, a **planned well** site on the southeast corner of Galveston St and Wade Dr, is one of several locations in Gilbert being evaluated to develop drinking water wells.



Drilling activity is scheduled to begin at this location with the contractor mobilizing to the site in early April and drilling rig set-up and activity scheduled to begin the week of April 8. Well drilling is a 24/7, day and night activity to minimize issues with the drill rig or subsurface conditions. Sound attenuation walls will be installed in advance of drilling to minimize noise disturbance, and light equipment will be used to maintain a safe work zone during night hours but will

be directed away from residences to the extent possible. A more detailed description of the well drilling process is available at gilbertaz.gov/cip or scan the QR code.

Later in the drilling process, crews will install a temporary above-ground pipeline along the east side of Wade Dr from the well site south to Williams Field Rd, to discharge well water during testing. Wade Dr will remain open for travel; however, it may be necessary to restrict the bike lane or other access during



that time. Once drilling is complete, a future effort will include outfitting the well and making pipeline connections to Gilbert's water treatment and distribution system. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this work.
