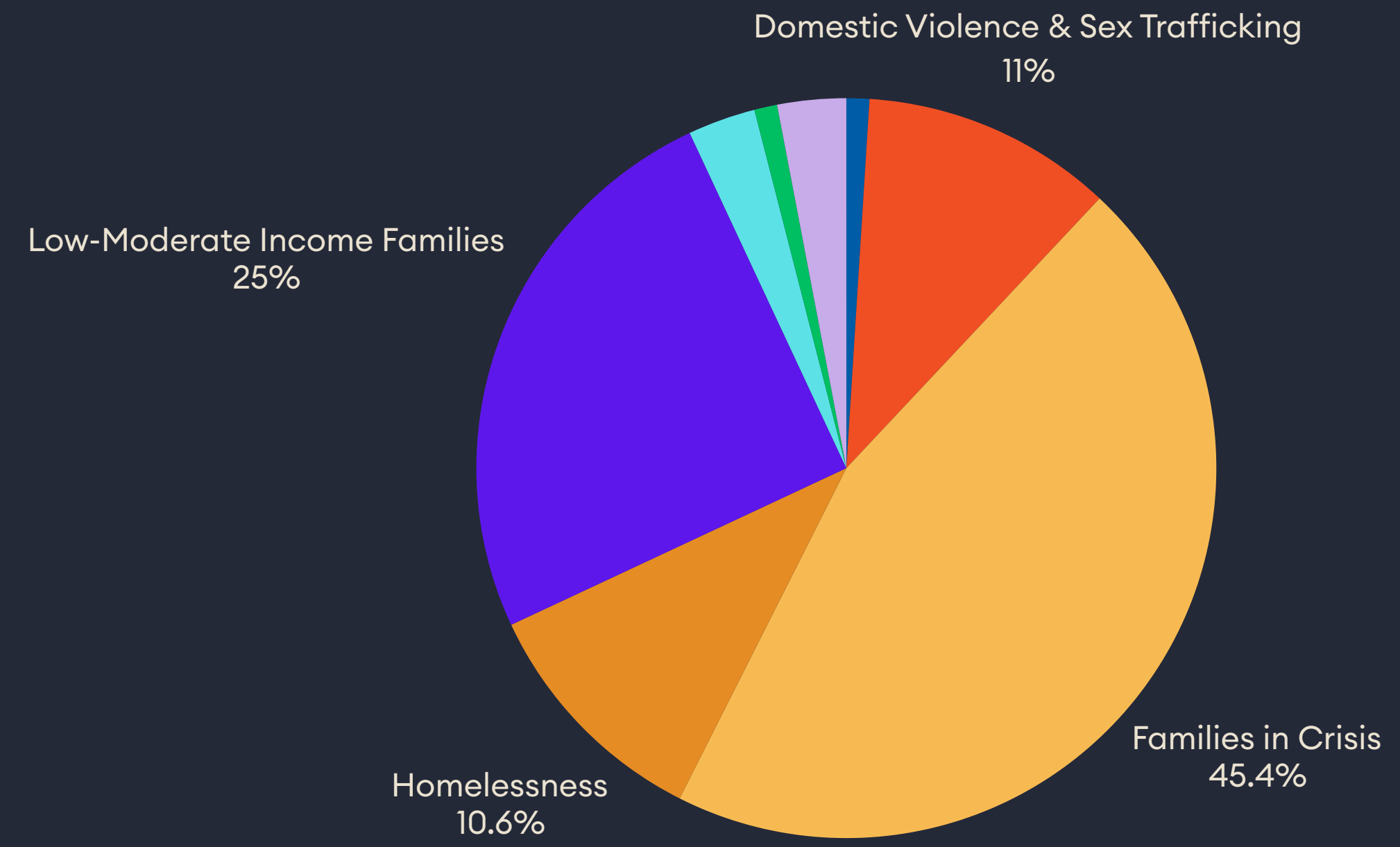
Gilbert Goodies Town Store offers a variety of unique gifts and a way to give back to the community with 100% of proceeds benefiting the N2N program.

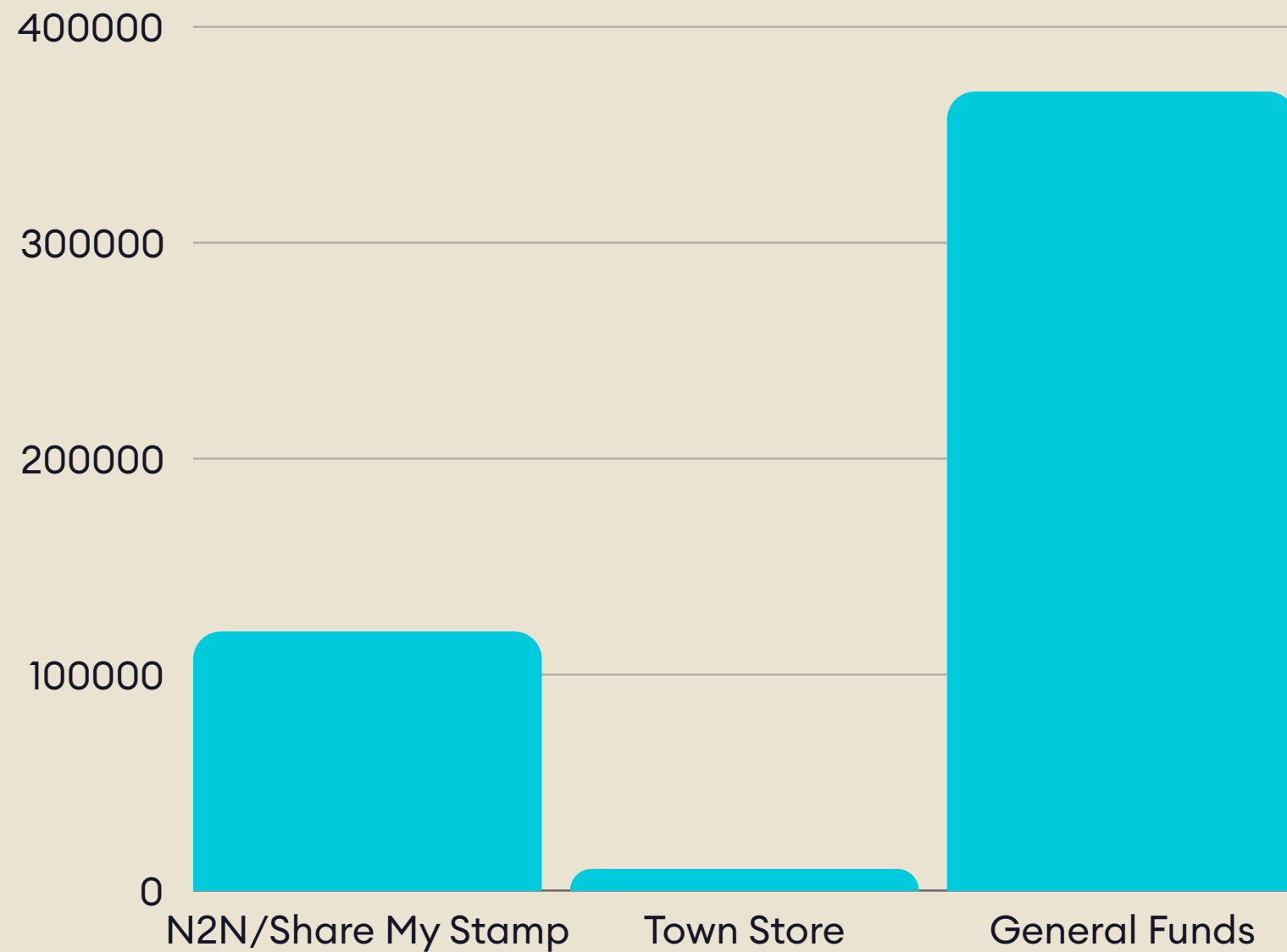

January 2, 2025	Application Opens at 8:00 AM
February 2, 2025	Application Closes at 6:00 PM
February/March	Committee Review and Score
April/May	Applicant Notification: Required documents, insurance and signed contracts
July 1, 2025- June 30, 2026	Contract Year

Requirements

Contract

Review the Scope of Work

Insurance

Must have updated insurance at the start of the contract year

Quarterly Reports

Submit reports in a timely manner to report out on contract progress, outcomes, successes & challenges

Invoice

Monthly, quarterly, or bi-annual

Annual Report

Submit annual report that is utilized to report out to town council and the community
